Your First Love

Do you remember your first love? Considering its February and Valentine Day, I thought I would speak about your first love. My so-called "first love" was back when I was ten or eleven years old. A little girl that lived in our neighborhood and rode a pink Schwinn bicycle and could run like a rabbit. I would always pick her for my baseball team, not because she was good, but because she was cute and could run. I remember asking my mother, "how do you know if you are in love?" I will never forget her answer. She said, "when someone is on your mine more than food." I thought, Wow! I will never be in love. I guess what my mom was telling me was that you will know true love because the object of your love will control your every thought, time and treasure.

Jesus told the church of Ephesus thru his Apostle John in **Revelation 2:4**, <u>"thou hast left thy first love."</u> In the verse's prior, Jesus had nothing but praise for the church. He said, they were standing up to the task. He said, "I know thy works, and thy labour, and thy patience..." Ephesus was an active church, no faith without works here. Ephesus was the kind of church any of us would have been happy to be a part of. Jesus also said they were standing for the truth. He said, "thou canst not bear them which are evil: and thou hast tried them which say they are apostles, and are not, and hast found them liars." This church knew the truth, they knew the doctrine of the apostles and what they believed. As one preacher said, "They did not back up, they would only stand up for truth and would not shut up. They refused to compromise to the world around them. But the church of Ephesus also stood up to the Test. Ephesus, "hast borne, and hast patience, and for my name's sake hast laboured, and hast not fainted." They had their enemies, and those who tried their patience, but they held true to the word of God.

So why did Jesus say, "they left their first love?" Simply put... like my mother said, "first love," is not an order in which love comes, but a priority in your life. What Jesus was telling the church of Ephesus was their priority of love had changed. John put it this way in **1 John 3:18** "My little children, let us not love in word, neither in tongue; but in deed and in truth." Love is to be a verb, an action word in our life. Love is not only the reason we serve our Lord, but also the result of our Lord. John continues later in his epistle to better explain love, and then says in **1 John 4:19** "We love him, because he first loved us." Jesus loved us so much that while we were yet sinners, he died for our sins. He didn't love us because of what we did, but despite what we did. Just like James said, "Faith without works is dead." Jesus told the church at Ephesus that, "Service without Love is meaningless."
