- Did you also know that on July 1, 1847, the United States Post office issued its first general issue postage stamp costing 5 cents? The stamp honored Benjamin Franklin the first Postmaster General under the Continental.
- On July 2, 1776, the Second Continental congress voted for independence from Britain.

- On July 4, 1776, the Congress approved the final draft of the Declaration of Independence, which was actually written a month earlier, in June and edited by John Adams and Benjamin Franklin.
- It wasn't until July 8th that the first public reading of the Declaration of Independence took place at Pennsylvania State House (now Independence Hall).
- It may surprise you to know that it wasn't until August 2nd, 1776, that John Hancock and 55 others signed their name to the Declaration of Independence.

July 11th is International Town Criers Day.

- July 17th is World Emoji Day.
- July 22nd is Spooner's Day. (Slip of the tongue. i.e. runny bunny instead bunny rabbit)
