"Anything Goes"

Maybe a few of you will remember a "somewhat" popular old song written back in 1934 by Cole Porter. The lyrics of the song, though speaking of the early 20th Century, celebrate the moral free fall of the American society. "We've rewound the clock," say the lyrics. Profanity and nudity are in vogue, and "now God knows—anything goes." The words and the philosophy appear to greatly represent the moral relativism that has shaped our culture. American, a county founded and formed by a distinct desire to serve a Biblical view of a sovereign God is on the brink of spiritual collapse.

The words of **Genesis 6:5**, which is a description of the society, at that time, that was swept away by the flood, could be repeated today's society: "Then the LORD saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually." As believers of God's word, it shouldn't surprise us at the depths to which humanity continues to sink, because Scripture clearly speaks of man's inclination to sin. In **2 Timothy 3:1–5**, we are reminded "that in the last days perilous times will come: For men will be lovers of themselves . . . without self-control, brutal, despisers of good . . . lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, having a form of godliness, but denying its power." It is no wonder that we have found ourselves in a place where "anything goes."

Our modern-day world has only rejection for the revelation of God's word, and his power has become a punch line to the media. The fall of man that began in the Garden of Eden continues to this day. We live in an age of depravity, where the shameful acts of yesterday are the celebrated triumphs of today. Perversion has become the norm today and purity is labeled as narrow-minded, and personal pleasure is viewed as the option for all.

Ironically, for Cole Porter, the writer of the song "Anything Goes," He not only wrote the song, but he lived out its philosophy. His secretary expressed that her boss never found the strength that came from faith in God. The philosophy of "anything goes" might be the standard but it does not satisfy. Our Lord has placed His church here for times like these, and we cannot and should not be drawn into the corruption of our culture. Instead, we're to shine like stars in the night and hold firmly to the Word of truth in a crumbling culture. Paul told the church at Philpi in **Philippians 2:15–16**, "That ye may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world; Holding forth the word of life; that I may rejoice in the day of Christ, that I have not run in vain, neither laboured in vain." It's easy to condemn the culture of our age—and we certainly have the biblical authority to speak the truth and expose sin—but we also need to demonstrate Christ to our world.
