Appreciate Your Pastor

How then shall they call on him in whom they have not believed? and how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? and how shall they hear without a preacher? On one of my "under-appreciated-pity party times," we stopped to eat and when finished, waiting for the bill, Ms. Renee walked over, and said she paid for our meal. Now understand, I'm not being rude, but I was well-aware of the living conditions Ms. Renee faced, I had been in her home many times, she enjoyed few luxuries and worked hard for what she had. For her to pay for our meal was a great sacrifice, and it touched my heart for her to do so. When I tried to refuse, she said, "I can't do much, but I wanted you know how much I appreciate you." WOW! To this day, I have never forgotten her act of kindness.

To each pastor reading this, let me say on behalf of each church member "thank you for your faithful service." You may not always feel the appreciation of your church, and sadly, some are not very good at showing it. However, over this past nearly two years of the COVID-19 pandemic our pastors have faced some difficult decisions and stressful times. Baptists can be difficult to please and where there are two Baptist gathered, there are three different opinions. As the Apostle Paul said to the church of Thessalonica; "We give thanks to God always for you all, making mention of you in our prayers; Remembering without ceasing your work of faith, and labour of love, and patience of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ, in the sight of God and our Father;" (1 Thess. 1:2-3)

Could I encourage each of our churches to show your appreciation to the man of God that the Lord has placed over you as your shepherd. Not just during the month of October, but throughout the year. Drop a
