People I Could Do Without

"With all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another in love;

Endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace."

(Ephesians 4:2-3)

Are there some people around you that get on your nerves, make you angry? My dad had a saying when he got so frustrated with someone, (often me or my brothers...) he would say, "He makes me so mad I can't see straight." I never really knew what that meant, but I never liked being on the receiving end of his frustration. Now don't most of us know what it's like to be pushed to our whit's end with some annoying person in your life.

In his book entitled, <u>"People I Could Do Without,"</u> Donald Smith says our frustration with people can send us into **one of two modes**: a "reactionary rampage" or a "silent rage." I guess that is like "can't see straight."

God's word addresses this frustration we often have with people. Paul encourages the Ephesian believers to "bear with one another." The phrase, "bear with," in one form or another is used some thirteen times in the New Testament. It means, "to endure patiently, to put up with, to be indulgent, to suffer." The phrase carries the idea of longsuffering and being slow to be angry. Paul later tells the Colossae church that they should... "Put on therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, bowels of mercies, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, longsuffering; Forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye." (Colossians 3:12-13) Basically, Paul is saying... we need to bear with those who bug us and if someone has wronged us, we're to forgive as the Lord has forgiven us — even those who persecute us.

I have some friends that pastor in Mayfield KY who tell me this story is not true of their area, but you find it on several sites. However, in the late 1800s there were two deacons in a small Baptist church in Mayfield, Kentucky. They didn't get along and always opposed each other in any decision the church made. On one particular Sunday, one deacon put up a small wooden peg on the back wall, for the preacher to hang his hat on. When the other deacon discovered the peg, he was outraged and left the church. The church split and a new church was formed called the "Anti-Peg Baptist Church."

President Lyndon B. Johnson certainly had his share of controversies and adversaries during his time in office. He told some reporters that, "If one morning I walked on top of the water across the Potomac River, the headline that afternoon would read: "The President Can't Swim."

Proverbs 14:10 says, "The heart knoweth his own bitterness;" Do you have any unresolved anger or bitterness toward a church member, or a friend? When bitterness is allowed to breed, it will always lead to an offspring of antagonism which hurts those around you while destroying yourself in the process.
