## O Holy Night! Jesus Came to Change the World

As we draw closer to the Christmas season; Julie starts watching Christmas movies and listening to Christmas music in early November. Anyway, that is not my point. One of my wife's favorite songs during Christmas is "O Holy Night." Did you know that the Christmas hymn "O Holy Night" was composed by Adolph Charles Adam, a French composer? Ironically, the church authorities at that time criticized it for poor taste and a "total absence of the spirit of religion."

In the first stanza, the writer invites us to imagine the world before Jesus' birth. He describes it as a world "in sin and error pining," where the human spirit withers through grief and pain. This paints a picture of darkness and despair. But then, the next three words, "till He appeared," bring a glimmer of hope and change.

A president of a prominent theological seminary was at a meeting with the chairman of an accreditation committee when the committee asked him to define the purpose of his institution. Without hesitation, the seminary president declared, "The purpose of this institution is to change the world."=

Surprised by this response, the committee members clarified, "You don't understand. While influencing the world is the general purpose of education, I'm asking you specifically, 'What is the purpose of this school?" The seminary president reiterated, "The purpose of our school is to change the world."

This is precisely why Jesus came into the world—to change it. At no time of the year are we more reminded of the profound impact He has had than during the Christmas season. Unlike the gospel writers, Paul never recounts the story of Christmas. However, in his words written to the church of Philippi, he illuminates the glory of Christmas and explains why the night of Jesus' birth was such a Holy Night.

(Philippians 2:5-11) Paul says that Jesus, "... made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross. Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."


