### **Revival Brings New Life to a Small Kentucky Baptist Church**

My thoughts these days are spent thinking and praying a great deal for our September Crusade. I hope you are as well. In 1995, I was pastor of Olive Branch Baptist church located north of Madisonville KY. near the small town of Hanson Ky. While I was there, just north of us was the little town of Slaughters Ky. Out in the countryside of Slaughters sets a little country church called **Mt. Gilead General Baptist Church**.

What began as a scheduled youth discipleship event at **Mt. Gilead**, became an ongoing revival marked by repentance, salvations, baptisms, and a renewed hunger for the Word of God.

Following a period of unrest at the local high school, church leaders and members felt a deep burden to pray. In response, the congregation organized focused, round-the-clock intercession, asking God to bring peace, healing, and spiritual awakening to their community. Those prayers were soon answered in ways no one could have planned.

Beginning in mid-September, regular gatherings grew night after night as young people and families filled the church to worship, hear the gospel, and respond publicly to Christ. According to church leadership, attendance quickly reached several hundred—remarkable for a town of fewer than 200 residents. During the early days of the revival, dozens of individuals professed faith in Jesus Christ, and many followed in believer's baptism as a public testimony of their new life in Him.

What has stood out most is the sincerity of the response. Students began gathering to pray and worship before school. Scripture verses appeared around the community as visible reminders of hope. Young people openly shared their faith, and several testified to sensing a call to ministry. Church leaders described the movement not as emotional hype, but as a genuine work of the Holy Spirit producing lasting fruit.

Revival is not confined to one town or one generation. When God's people humble themselves, pray, and proclaim Christ, He is still able to bring renewal—one life, one church, and one community at a time.
